Top 5 achievements in my first six months in

My first six months in post as Chief Executive have been an illuminating and enjoyable journey, meeting many stakeholders across Milton Keynes. From those who access services, to those who pay for and provide



them, it has been a fantastic opportunity to get a better understanding of how people experience Health and Care services in Milton Keynes. Healthwatch Milton Keynes has a very broad remit, and one of our many challenges will continue to be how we prioritise the issues that matter and affect local people the most. We have been successful in making some real impacts in a number of areas. Here are my top 5 highlights of the last six months:

- 1) Undertaking our first set of Enter and View activities at Milton Keynes Hospital
- 2) Recommending changes to how people are communicated to when they are making choices about their pathway out of hospital and into residential care
- 3) Talking to the Health and Wellbeing Board about how Healthwatch can support you, and feeding in to the consultation for the Milton Keynes Health and Wellbeing strategy which is launching soon
- 4) Linking up with Milton Keynes Clinical Commissioning Group (MK CCG) to look at how communication can be improved between MK CCG and Patient Participation Groups, at GP Practices
- 5) Learning that diagnostic overshadowing (when you have a medical issue that may be mistakenly linked to a pre-existing long-term condition), and a lack of mental health support for people with long term health conditions can have life-limiting consequences for some people. We are going to explore this further over the coming months.

Enter and View

We completed our first Enter and View survey of Milton Keynes University Hospital NHS Foundation Trust's (MK Hospital) Red2Green service in wards 17 and 18.

Red2Green is a national initiative to ensure that each day a patient is in hospital is getting them closer to discharge.

How did it work?

Two Enter and View Authorised Representatives interviewed all patients well enough to take part about how they found the communication about their care.

We wanted to find out if patients felt well informed about what was happening each day with their care, and when they were likely to be discharged.

This is the first of a programme of visits to MK Hospital.

MK Hospital has been very supportive and welcomed the opportunity to hear how people feel about their hospital stay.

Our findings

A report has been sent to MK Hospital for fact and accuracy checking, and to allow them to respond to the findings and recommendations.

We have published the final report, with MK Hospital's report, on our website.

The report has also been presented to MK Hospital CEO, the Care Quality Commission, Healthwatch England and NHS England.

Stakeholder AGM Highlights

We wanted to share some of the highlights from recent AGMs for Milton Keynes Clinical Commissioning Group (MKCCG), Milton Keynes University Hospital NHS Foundation Trust (MK Hospital), Mind BLMK and Community

Action: MK.



MKCCG's new paediatric service and diabetes service are producing noticeable improvements to patient care. MKCCG has also recently been awarded primary care status, which gives it more responsibility for local services, including better integrated out-of-hospital and community services.

We learned from MK Hospital CEO Joe Harrison about development plans for hospital site, including a cancer centre and radio therapy unit.

Community Action: MK presented MK Community Foundation's Vital Signs report, which highlights the state of both mental and physical health in Milton Keynes. It highlights a 45% rise in hospital admissions for substance abuse among 15 to 24 year olds.

Mind BLMK reported the sad statistic that 70% of young people in crisis report not getting the mental health support they needed at the right age or time. Mind BLMK highlighted the need for increased public spending on mental health campaigns. In Milton Keynes, specialist therapists are now attached to Mind BLMK IAPT (Improving Access to Psychological Therapies) services.
